Dogs die in hot cars - advice

Leaving a dog in a car on a warm day even in the shade with the window open can be dangerous. At just 22 degrees, the car interior can reach an unbearable 47 degrees - dogs can quickly become dehydrated, develop heat stroke or even die.

Signs of distress or heat stroke include heavy panting, vomiting, dribbling, diarrhoea, weakness, drowsiness or a state of collapse.

If the dog is in distress, call the police (999) immediately.

Breaking the window to get the dog out is legally only acceptable if you believe the owner of the car would consent to your action.

Cool a dog gradually – too fast and it could go into shock. If unconscious/very unwell, the dog should see a vet immediately.



Sponsored abseil July 20th at Ilkley Cow and Calf

Six of us (including four with a fear of heights) have committed to abseil down rocks, including one at about 100 feet on the third Sunday in July.
